



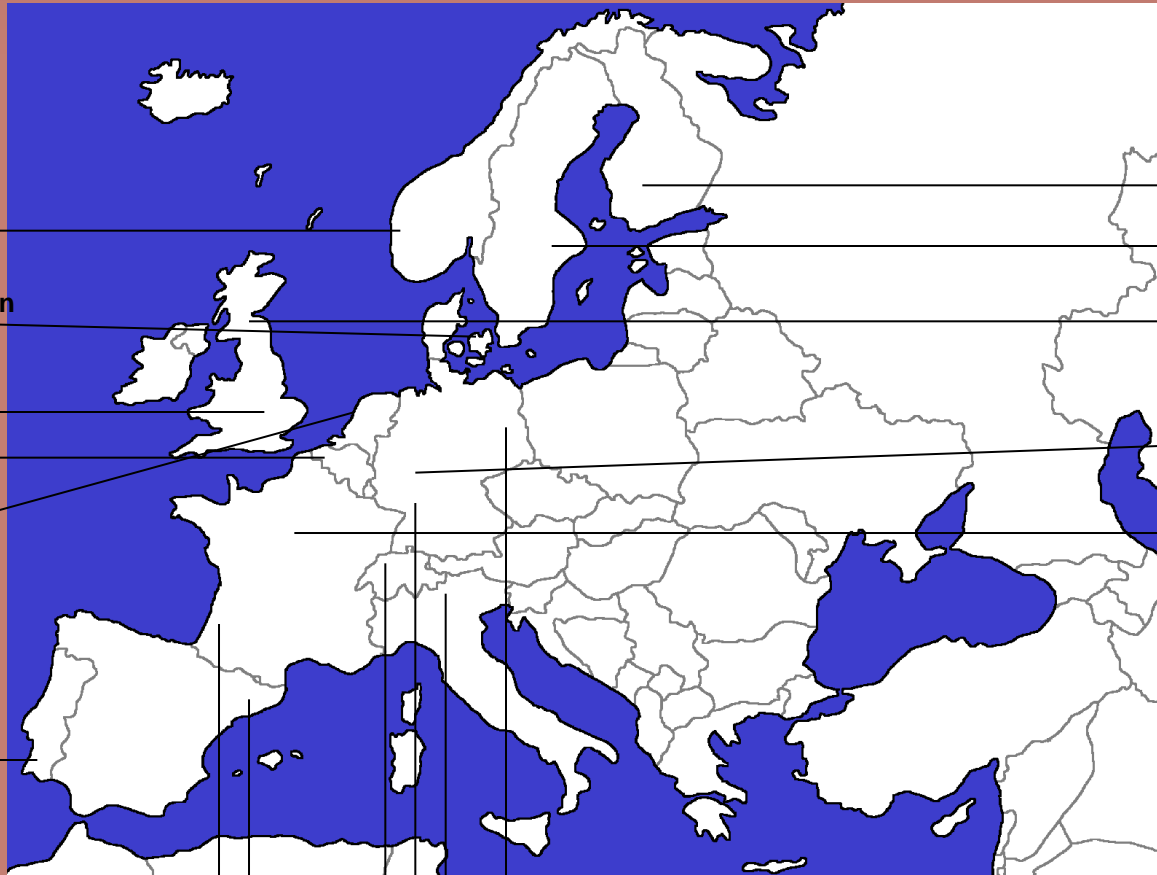

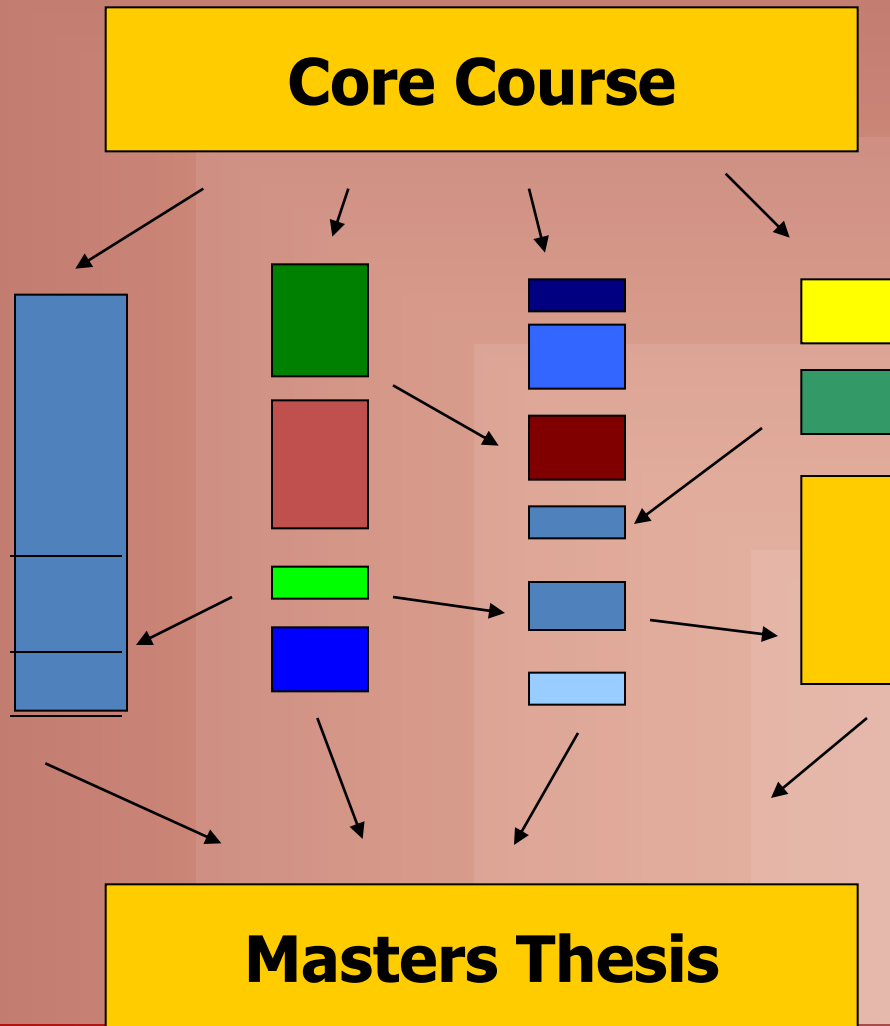
Network Focus

- Work experience

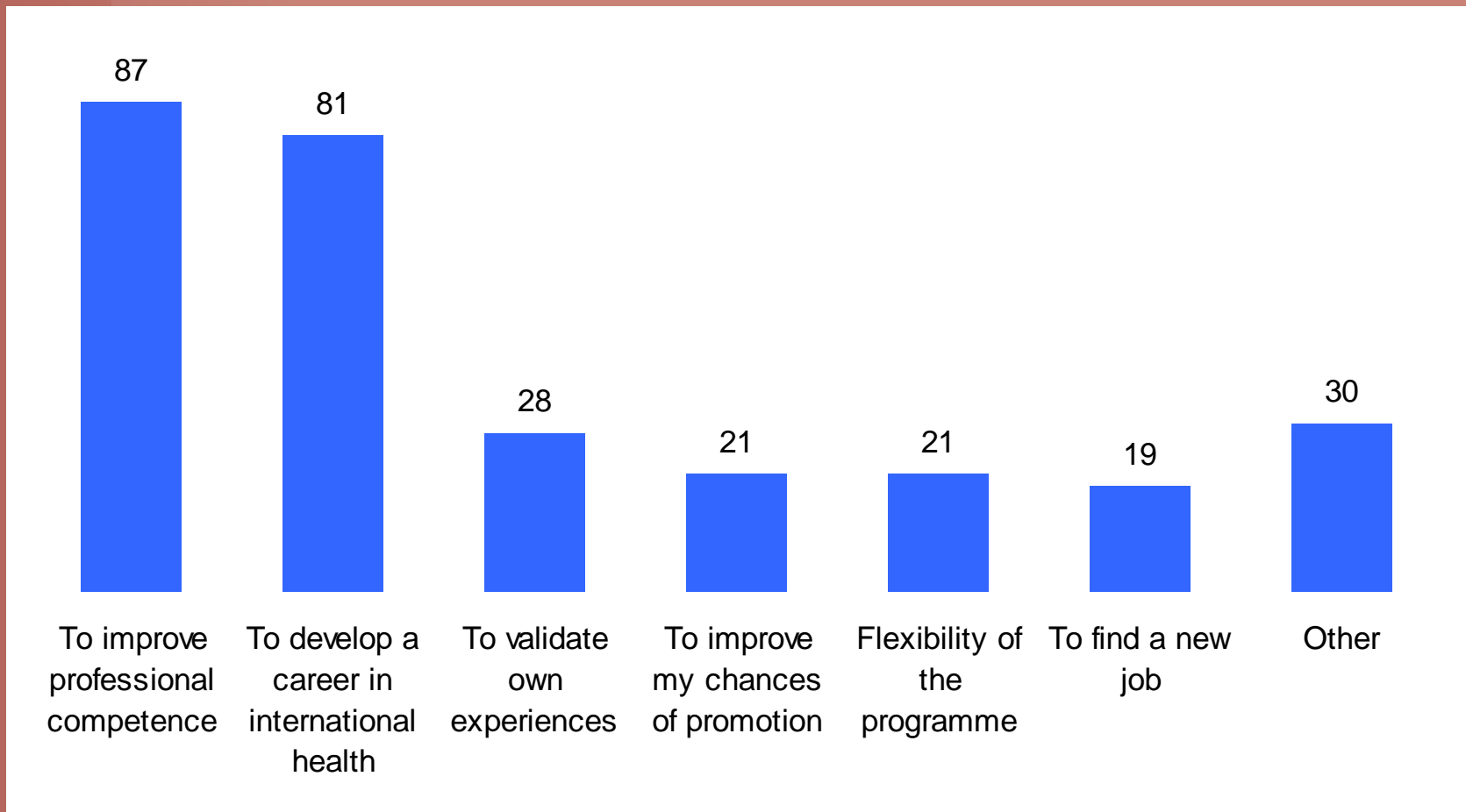
Benefits

- Interaction with different students, facilitators, institutions

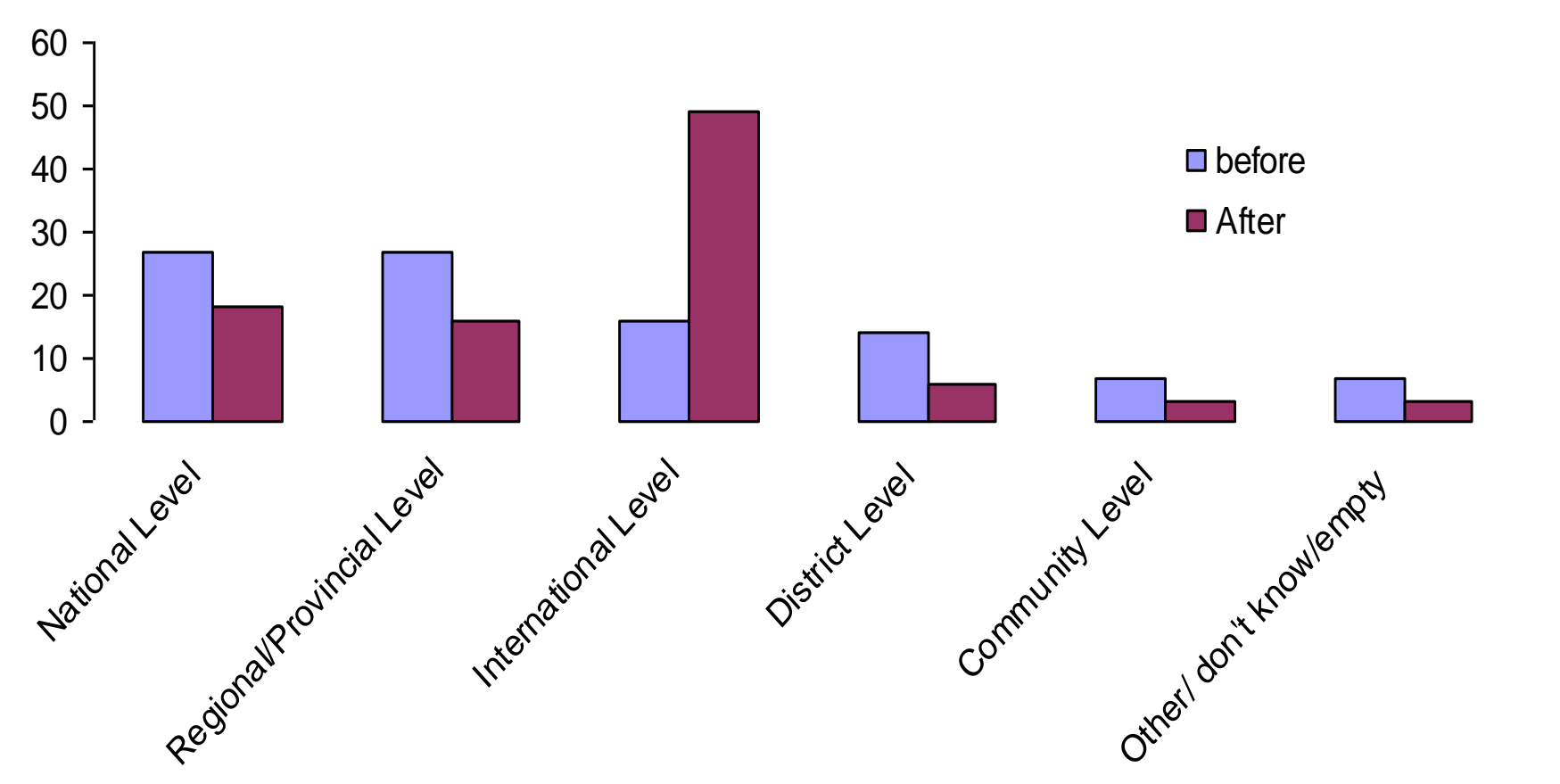

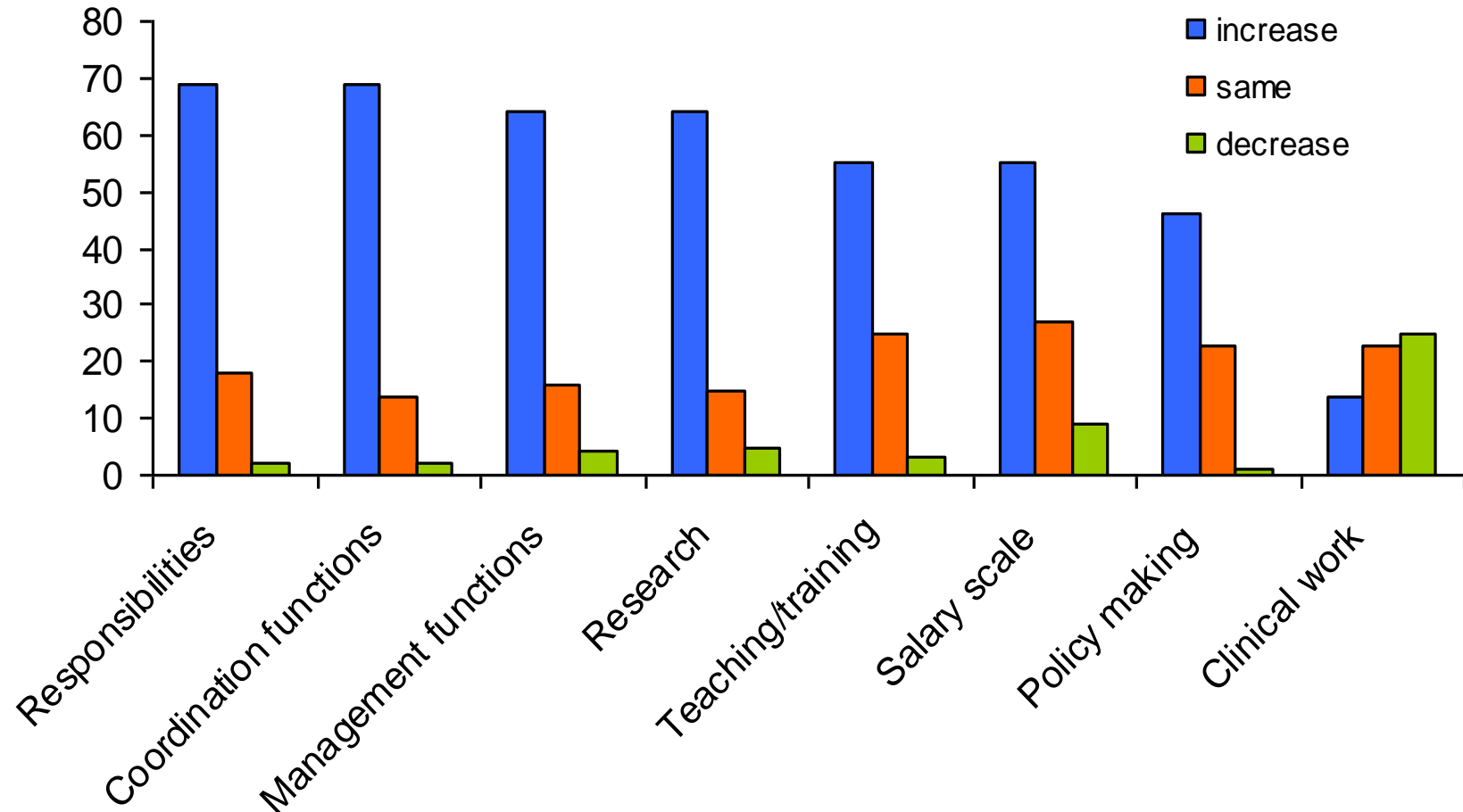
Three main reasons to do a TropEd MIH
