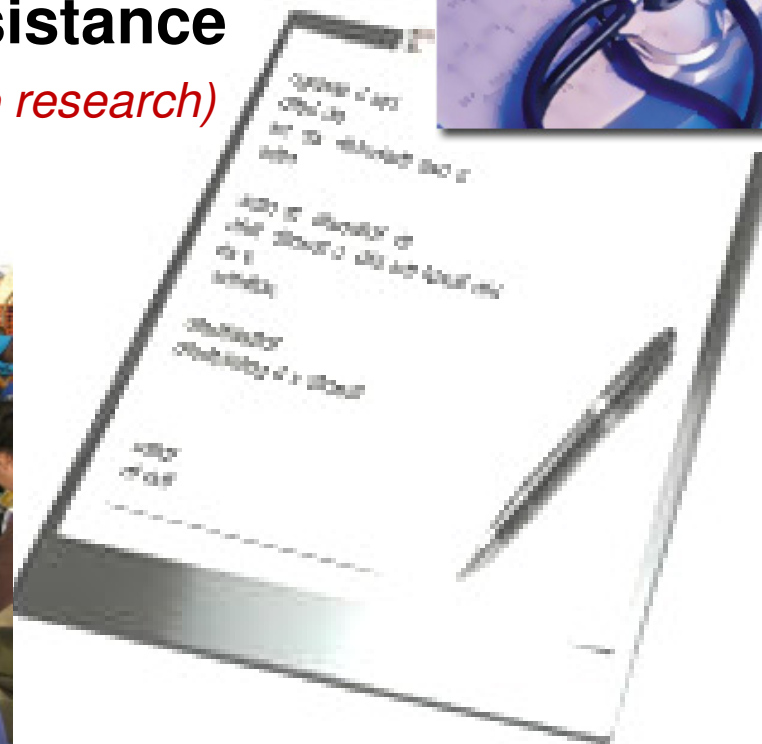
- ❖ Clear increase of natural and climatic disaster as well as armed conflicts

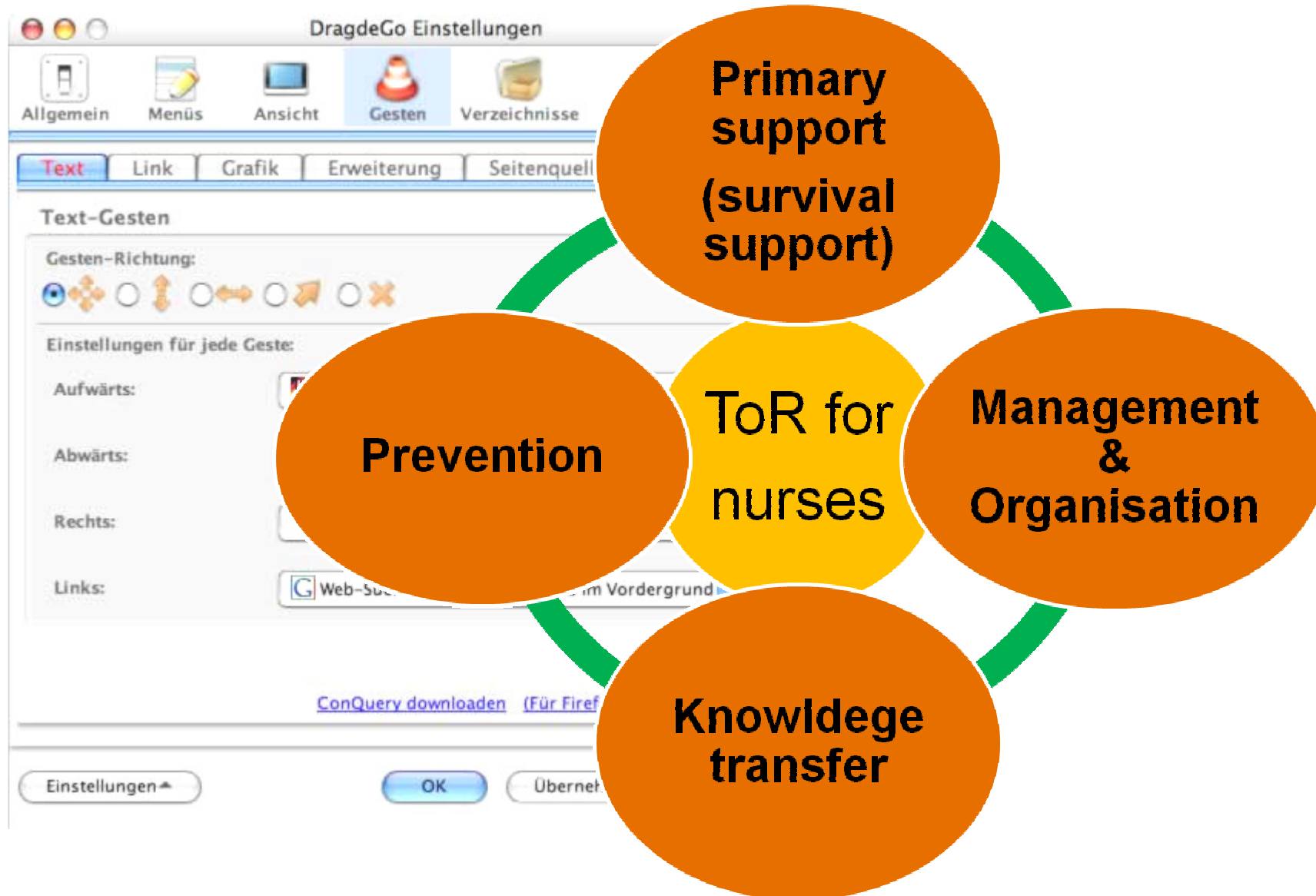

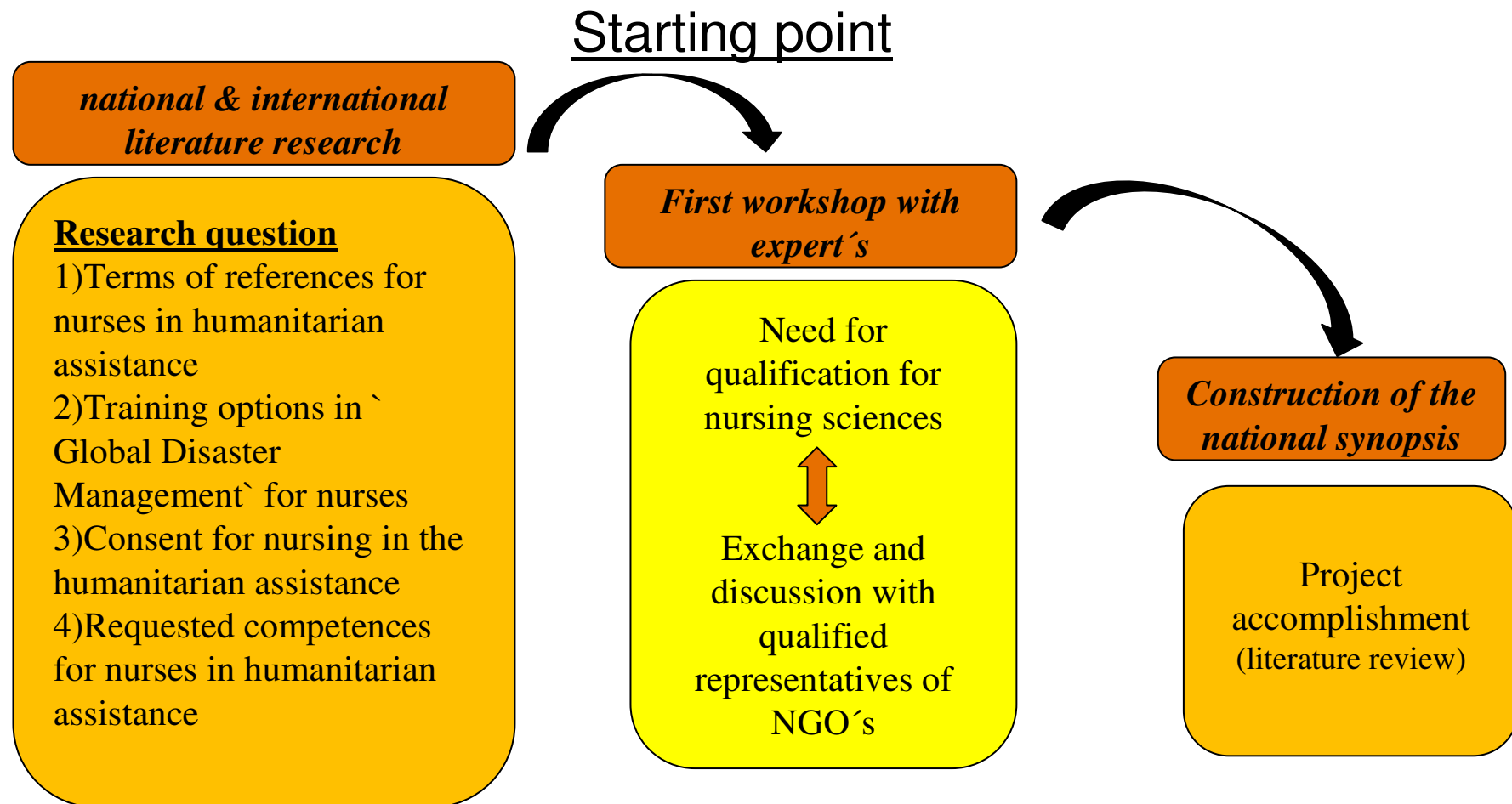

Terms of references for NURSES in humanitarian assistance

Creation of a national synopsis



- 1. Research:**
 - ✓ Determination of the actual number of recruited nurses in the humanitarian assistance (2009)
 - ✓ operational area & working focus of the recruited nurses
 - ✓ strain & stressful situation for nurses
- 2. Sustainable networking** (nursing alliances, universities, NGO's)
 - a) exchange ideas
 - b) assess the demand regarding training & further education of nurses
- 3. Definition of a domain of core requirements** (requested competences for nurses working in humanitarian assistance)
- 4. Construction of a framework concept** (standards, guidelines & curricular values for the training and further education for nurses, teachers & senior management in nursing, which may be available for national / international response or responsible for training)
- 5. Optimisation of conditions for nursing professionals in the field**

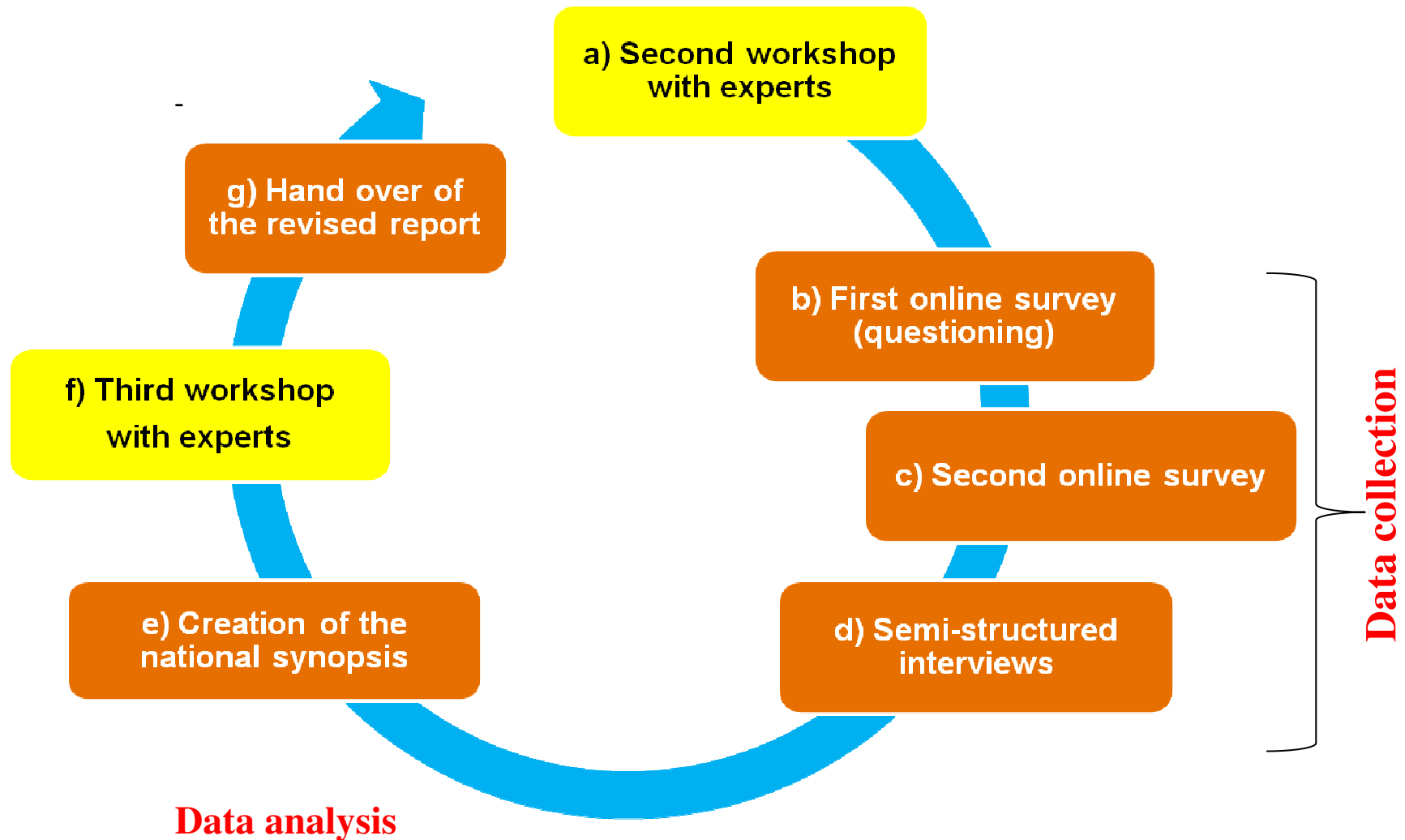
Research Questions



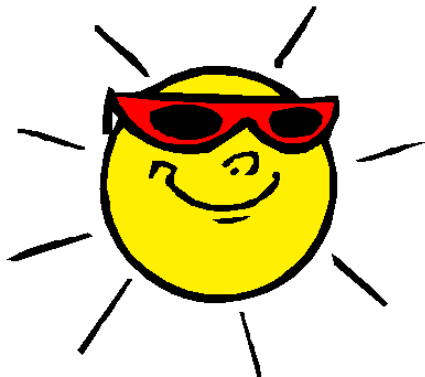
As-is-analyses as empirical background:

1. **How many** nurses are recruited for humanitarian assistance yearly (Germany)? What are their **terms of references**?
2. Which **competences** (context) are currently imparted by who (e. g. organisation, nursing school, university)? Which competences are required from all organisations? Which competences are singular required? Is there a curricular focus visible?
3. What are the **prospective requirements** beyond the known competences?
4. Does a **general education** system or **specialisation** make sense in this context?
5. Is the development of a further **education curriculum** or a **Master in cooperation with the NGO`s** and the **university** important and reasonable?
